Sustaining Educational Excellence for Wyoming Students Wyoming K-5 Literacy Framework Project

Partnership Highlights

- Wyoming Department of Education (WDE) updated its literacy MTSS processes and documents.
- ➡ WDE updated its K-3 Literacy Guidance Framework and developed a Dyslexia Handbook.
- Arapahoe Elementary School co-developed a K-5 curriculum for narrative, informational, and opinion writing and participated in on-site professional development (PD) events with the Region 11 Comprehensive Center (R11CC) and the University of Wyoming Literacy Research Center and Clinic (UWLRCC).
- Wind River Elementary School co-developed and implemented a vocabulary framework during on-site professional development events with the R11CC and UWLRCC.
- The R11CC co-developed knowledge management sites to support literacy resources at pilot schools.

Pilot: Arapahoe Elementary School

Project focus: WRITING

After a needs assessment was completed in 2021, school educators participated annually in six on-site professional learning events, which modeled **evidencebased writing strategies** for classroom use. These sessions evolved into **collaborative planning meetings** with individual teachers, resulting in the creation of **lesson plans** and graphic organizers to enhance student writing. Additionally, a K–5 **writing curriculum** aligned with the Wyoming State Content Standards was codeveloped, and individual teachers received coaching on **narrative, informational, and opinion writing**.

From continuous improvement exit surveys, **educators** shared positive feedback of the experience. For example:

"I plan to bring more writing into my classroom and use more reflection and organizers with multiple charts to give students a strategy to be successful in their writing."

Pilot: Wind River Elementary Project focus: VOCABULARY

After a needs assessment was completed in 2022, six on-site professional learning events were conducted annually, modeling evidence-based vocabulary strategies for classroom use. These sessions featured a schoolwide book study, coordination of book author visits, and the development of a comprehensive vocabulary framework focused on vocabulary instruction. Strategies were modeled in the classroom, transitioning later to collaborative lesson planning. The team also supported new staff in designing effective vocabulary lessons using the vocabulary framework.

From continuous improvement exit surveys, **educators** shared positive feedback of the experience. For example:

"The long-term nature of this PD is great! Moving beyond a silo view of vocabulary to an integrated approach to comprehension seems like the next step."

Our Journey Forward

Wyoming Department of Education

- Create and share modules from the recordings of literacy PD, webinars, and training materials to be available to all districts and schools for training on the WDE website.
- •• Advocate for more funding for literacy.
- Apply for a grant to give districts another opportunity to fund literacy development.

The Pilot School Districts

- Apply for grants to fund literacy development.
- Continue to change the school culture to focus on student learning.
- Wind River Elementary: Include vocabulary training in their induction process for new teachers; continue to update the Vocabulary Framework; and focus on reading comprehension through a sustained reading program.
- Arapahoe Elementary: Follow the PD plan for professional learning community training, which includes development of subject area learning targets and assessments, and implement the writing curriculum.

Individual Teachers

- Pursuing master's degrees in literacy
- Completing LETRS training.
- Ongoing professional development and dedicated time for planning, based on exit tickets and listening sessions feedback.
